

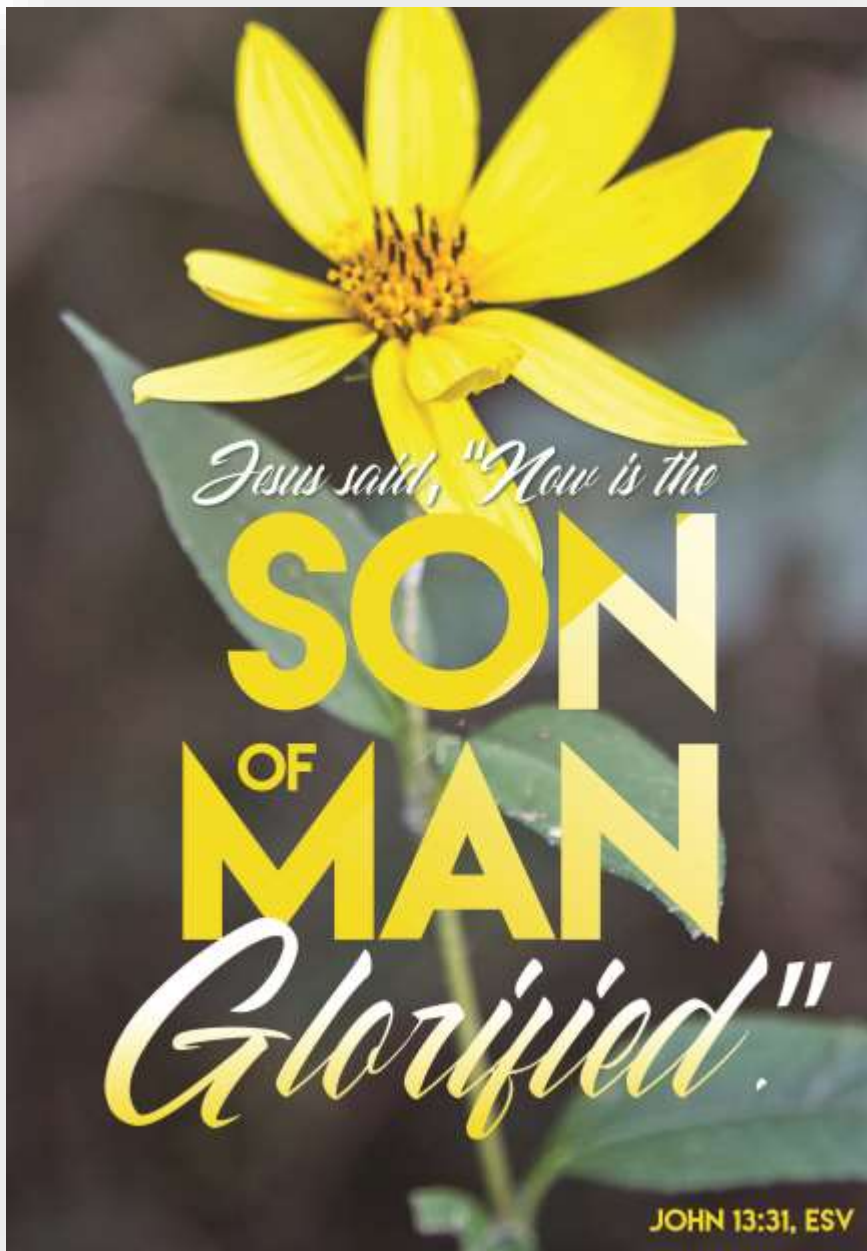

Then, one by one, the Osage began to be killed off. . . . As the death toll rose, the newly created FBI took up the case, and the young director, J. Edgar Hoover, turned to a former Texas Ranger named Tom White to try to unravel the mystery. . . .”

Library Update - From April Flowers to May Flowers in Your Church Library



As of this writing, April showers abound. Well-chosen reading enhances that refreshing and proverbial harbinger of May flowers.

To guide you, your children, and your grandchildren through this seasonal theme, your library has many attractive choices. The *Flower Alphabet Book* (E 582.13 Pal), is a feast for the eyes as well as a linguistic treat. With flowers come butterflies. To explore the Creator's breathtaking wonders through these amazing creatures, see *The Butterfly Book* (595.78 Sto).

For more hands-on possibilities, try *Let's Make a Garden* (E Fic Lob) or *Tending the Garden* (231.7 Gra.). Help children make the connection between the good earth and healthy plants. See *Up in the Garden and Down in the Dirt* as well as *Over and under the Pond* and its companion, *Over and Under the Snow*. For adults, there is *Food and Faith* (261.8 Sch).

Tying a love for plants to Scripture are *Consider the Lilies* (220.8 Pat) and *The Colors of Creation* (E 231 Thi).

Several novels are particularly apt for this month. *The Language of Flowers* (Fic Dif) offers an appealing tale of a young girl overcoming personal challenges as she discovers and develops a gift for choosing and arranging flowers. Other promising choices are: *The Second Half* ((Fic Sne) and *Garden of Dreams* (Fic Gou).

Of course, there's more to the month of May than earth and flowers. Many novels explore the place of mothers in our lives. A few worthy options: Leslie Gould's *Beyond the Blue* (Fic Gou); local author Carole Estby Dagg's *The Year We Were Famous* (Fic Dag); and Nicole Mazzarella's *This Heavy Silence* (Fic Maz).

These titles suggest but a tiny sample of the riches tucked away on the shelves of your library. Let us help you locate them or discover other possibilities.

Reduce, Reuse, Recycle

Gardening with Native Plants

Native plants are adapted to the local climate and soil conditions where they naturally occur. These important plant species provide nectar, pollen, and seeds that serve as food for native butterflies, insects, birds, and other animals. Native plants do not require fertilizers and require fewer pesticides than lawns. They require less water than lawns and help prevent erosion. Native plants can reduce water runoff and, consequently, flooding. They help reduce air pollution. Native plantscapes don't require mowing. Excessive carbon from the burning of fossil fuels contributes to global warming. Native plants sequester, or remove, carbon from the air. They provide shelter and food for wildlife. They promote biodiversity and stewardship of our natural heritage. They are beautiful and increase scenic values. *Source: USDA Forest Service.*

Some Things To Not Buy Again

Styrofoam cups. Styrofoam is forever. It's not biodegradable. Buy recyclable or compostable paper cups. Better yet, get reusable mugs that you can take with you.

Farm-raised salmon. Several studies found that PCBs and other environmental toxins are present at higher levels in farm-raised salmon than in wild salmon.

Bleached coffee filters. Dioxins, chemicals formed during the chlorine bleaching process, contaminate groundwater and air and are linked to cancer. Look for unbleached paper filters. Better yet, use reusable filters.

Teak and mahogany. Every year, 27 million acres of rainforest are destroyed. Rainforests are home to over half of the world's wild plant, animal, and insect species. Look for Forest Stewardship Council certified wood. Better yet, buy used furniture, flooring, and other products made from used or salvaged wood. *Source: Green America.*

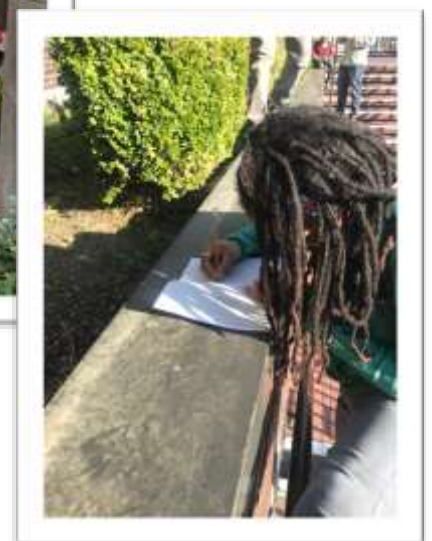
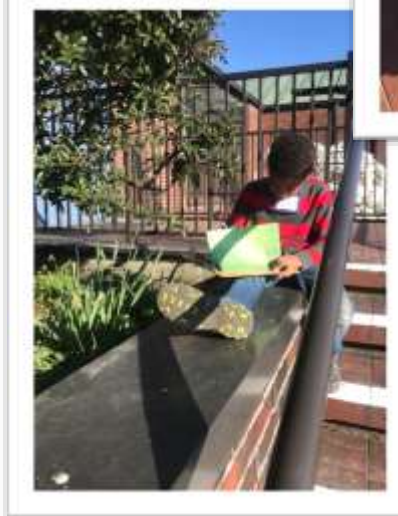
